While students take advantage of purpose built Junior School facilities, they also begin to integrate and explore the wider school through activities in the School Library, Music and Performing Arts Department and our expansive Physical Education program using our extensive grounds and facilities.

Our prime objective in these years of schooling is to build the literacy and numeracy foundations that will underpin success in their academic life. Our students develop into confident, resilient young individuals, ready to tackle the demands of the more challenging stages of the learning journey.

UPPER PRIMARY

Our focus in Years 3-6 at Alphington Grammar School continues to be literacy and numeracy, however in these years, we begin to foster and create opportunities for students to develop maturity and begin to increase their connection with the wider community. Our students begin developing a sense of purpose and understanding their role in the broader community in ways they have never experienced.

Having been introduced to important fundamentals in Lower Primary, the focus of Upper Primary at Alphington Grammar is introducing and beginning to implement the '16 Habits Of Mind'. Embracing change and learning that resilience is an important life skill is further enhanced for our Upper Primary Students through our change of environment, as the students move from the Early Primary building across to the purpose built Upper Primary wing of our school. This space includes open plan learning areas, which help to promote collaboration and creativity.

Our Year 6 students also have an insight into the world of leadership with several Primary School Leader roles available, as well as the opportunity to be members of the Student Representative Council. These students gain confidence, problem- solving skills, communication skills and learn about what it takes to be a successful leader.
