Alphington Grammar School is unique in Melbourne's educational landscape

Situated on 3 hectares of attractive parkland abutting Darebin Creek, just 7 kilometres from the CBD, Alphington Grammar School has been designed from its inception to be an academically strong, non- denominational, school that embraces and promotes Teaching and Learning excellence.

Alphington Grammar School is within easy reach of the inner, Eastern and Northern suburbs and accessible by public transport and major commuter corridors. The school also has a number of private bus services throughout the suburbs that bring students to our school. Alphington Grammar School also boasts an abundance of open space, shaded by native fauna and flora and mature landscape making it an idyllic learning environment.



From the Principal

The school welcomed 2023 with a sense of optimism open to new challenges, adventures, risks and opportunities. As educators we encourage children regularly to embrace change, challenge themselves, to be curious, to ask questions, to dig deeper, to pursue opportunities and explore new interests, and grow. We ask the same of ourselves as educators. After the last few years 2023 afforded us the chance to reevaluate and reset. It was a real joy to see students and families reconnect as one big community and witness firsthand the genuine desire to contribute fully to school life and seize the opportunities presented to them.

Our school is bursting with opportunities to learn and grow both in and out of the classroom. In 2023 students were involved in Sports Teams, Musical Ensembles, Productions and Concerts, Debating, Leadership opportunities, Chess Competitions, Camps, House Events, Community Service, Fundraising, and Visual Art Exhibitions. Students had the benefit of over 60 Clubs and Societies across the school, participated in Work Experience but to name just a few of the opportunities open to them in our School, however, amongst the greatest of opportunities was the ability to travel overseas again which saw over 100 students and staff visit London, Rome, Sicily and Greece in 2023 which included a physical trek through the Samarian Gorge in Crete.

The opportunities did not stop there, and our achievements were many. The STEM faculty proudly celebrated their best effort in the Computational Algorithmic Thinking (C.A.T) Competition with four of our students receiving distinctions placing them in the top 10% of the state. Our Debaters did us proud with 2 of our Year 12 students **Adam Patane** winning the best speaker in every one of this debates and **Chloe Portoglou** being invited to participate in the State Debating Competitions.

Our Greek language program continues to receive State Government recognition in the Early Years following the successful expansion of our **Greek Immersion Program**. Our commitment to our Greek founding forefathers and our multicultural underpinnings saw our students participate in Public Speaking and Film Festivals, writing and online language competitions with Alphington being awarded *First in Greek in the World* in the **Education Perfect** Competition.

The Interactive Exhibit showcased "Heros, Myths and Monsters" in both Chinese and Greek with many linked language activities, art competitions and even a seminar for parents raising children bilingually. Street performances, assemblies and multiple community events helps demonstrate to our students how interconnected and multicultural our world is.

Our **Sports** Faculty saw multiple successes: In Swimming seven students were placed third out of twenty one schools. Strength was evident in the Athletics with strong results in the 100, 200 and 400 metre events as well as shot put, discus and long jump. Our Primary School equally excelled in Junior Boys Soccer and Boys Tee Ball, and our Middle Years Boys and Girls Softball Teams. All made Grand Finals. The main issue for us as a school is that we must urgently build capacity with sporting infrastructure.

For a School our size I am proud to showcase the strength of the **Music and Performing Arts** faculties. 2023 has been the strongest year for the Private Instrumental program with 222 students participating. The largest cast successfully delivered the Secondary School Production "Into the Woods", the Prep to Year 4 production of Pirates versus Mermaids and Sea Fish was a sellout event and the Years 5 and 6 Production certainly showcased the incredible talent of our students. Multiple Soloist evenings, the Annual Music Concert, and visiting international musicians have all provided incredible performance opportunities for

our students. Equally, one only has to walk around the school to see the incredible creative talents of our students in **Art and Design** pieces proudly displayed everywhere.

Developing leadership opportunities for all year levels has been a real focus for us at Alphington, the **Student Leadership Team** both: the Primary and Secondary School Student Leaders of 2023 have gone above and beyond in so many ways to demonstrate "Servant Leadership" becoming a welcoming face and being visible in all aspects of school life. Aside from their individual portfolios our leaders have contributed as key pastoral care support agents to new students and those needing more support throughout their educational journey. They implemented a variety of fundraising events and introduced fresh ways to give back to the broader community. "Shave for a Cure" and the "Disability Soccer Players Exhibition Match" as well as the great work of our Environment Club are worthy community contributors. They have run school tours leading with both their Head and their Hearts. I thank all school leaders for their extraordinary contribution in 2023.

School Council

All our School Council members give much of their time voluntarily to help ensure good governance, the financial health of the School, determine strategy and commit to the infrastructure needs of our school. I have been fortunate to have shared my time as Principal with wonderful Chairs of School Council, most recently **Associate Professor Marinis Pirpiris** from 2017 to 2023. Alongside an incredibly busy professional life as a leading orthopaedic surgeon, who gives much time to training other surgeons here in Australia and overseas, Professor Pirpiris has stood by the School during our recent periods that saw a new administration block, STEM and Library added to the School. Alongside this, Professor Pirpiris was an immeasurable support to our School during the COVID years that saw the steady avalanche of locked down periods. His intimate knowledge of the medical world, his work in our leading hospitals meant we had up to date and relevant information on which we could base our decisions on. Professor Pirpiris has served our School incredibly well throughout his term in office however his very busy professional life makes it difficult to continue in the role. I thank Professor Pirpiris for his professional and personal support of me and our School.

In 2023 we to welcomed our new Co-Chairs of School Council **Mr Michael Karamitos** both a past parent of our School and member of the Greek Community Board and **Ms Angela Georgalis** (currently on maternity leave). It has been wonderful to work with Mr Karamitos on the school's next stage of growth and development and the new strategic plan. I thank Michael for his enthusiasm, energy and hands on approach to matters that affect our school.

Running a school cannot be done in isolation and, I take this opportunity to thank the Heads of Campus, **Mr Lukas Silver** and **Mrs Tracey Nicholson** and, the staff of Alphington Grammar School who give tirelessly of themselves supporting our students in and out of the classroom.

The financial health of our school is due to the checks and balances the School Finance Department has in place. I thank **Mrs Pippa Birch** for her stewardship for the last 3 years especially during the difficult COVID years and wish her well in her retirement. In 2023 we welcomed **Mrs Louisa Johnstone** our new Business Manager and **Ms Claudia Callero** our new Finance Manager as together they steer us through the next stage. 2023 presented them with more challenges than we could have imagined including the cyber attack which took up much of Mrs Johnstone's time and energy while still working on upgrading the financial systems she has inherited.

To the **Administration staff** whose support we are indebted to, I thank you them all for what they do throughout the year to ensure all operational levers are well oiled and work efficiently. As we have entered our 35th year since the School opened I look forward to all that 2024 will bring and continuing to build and strengthen our school.

The Highlights


There is an impressive range of individual results, with many students doing exceptionally well. These results are a testament to their commitment, resilience, and perseverance. We saw an increase of 6.5% in the ATARs above 80 averages from 51% in 2022 to 57.5% in 2023. The high standards our students have been able to achieve as a cohort is most noteworthy and a credit to the students and their teachers' commitment and skill.

Our students have performed strongly achieving a Median Study Score of 33. Our average ATAR has increased from 74% in 2021 to 79.5% in 2023, which well exceeds the State average of 69. In the League Tables AGS is now ranked 59 in the state out of all Victorian schools – up from 74^{th} in 2023.

The Dux for 2023 was **Costa Magiris**, who achieved an ATAR of 98.75 placing him in the top 1.25% of all students in the State. Costa, achieved outstanding results in English, Maths Methods, Physics, Greek and Data Analytics. Congratulations to Costa on his wonderful results.




Financial Operations



Learning Technologies

- AGS saw the biggest laptop program signed off for all Year 7 students in 2023. The laptop price was built into school fees (Model HP ProBook increased to 16GB RAM for better performance).
- 30 new HP ProBook's were distributed to staff as part of our 3-year rollout.
- Schoolbox upgraded to version 23.1.10 was signed off to go fully cloud hosted to provide better security and unlimited storage.
- Upgraded all staff to A5 (from A3) licensing with Microsoft which has a great security presence and includes the Microsoft Defender product. This has allowed us to remove the Mimecast product for email filtering.
